

DUBA PLAINS

OKAVANGO - KWEDI CONCESSION

Classic Wilderness Camp



One of the Delta's most remote camps, Duba Plains is a small, intimate camp on an island surrounded by expansive seasonally flooded plains and shaded by tall ebony, fig and mangosteen trees. Due to its proximity to the Panhandle, Duba Plains is one of the first camps in the northern Delta to receive annual floodwaters.



Accommodation is made up of six tents complete with en-suite bathroom, outside shower, and a small veranda overlooking the floodplain. Pathways link the tents to the main area, comprising dining room and bar, swimming pool and fireplace, all raised to take in the view. Activities include day and night game drives to view wildlife such as lion, buffalo, elephant, hippo in the channels and red lechwe on the floodplains; birdlife is abundant. Duba was the setting for *Relentless Enemies*, a National Geographic documentary of the classic lion and buffalo interaction unique to the area.
